PROGRAMS

Our programs offer a nurturing, Christian environment where children can grow and learn. Our program fits with the schedules of working parents in the community and meets all safety and health requirements to keep your child safe at all times. Our teachers are selected for their experience with children, knowledge of development, and love and care for children. We also employ students of Education and Early Childhood Development who have a love for children.

INFANT ROOM

Our infant room is for ages 6 weeks to 2 years old. We have a variety of toys such as blocks, dolls, electronic toys, and a playhouse. We also have soft books as well as board books. The daily routine includes reading, songs, dancing, ABCs, colors, and shapes. Parents supply breast milk, formula, food, diapers, wipes, and a change of clothes for accidents. Our teachers are ready to play!

PROGRAMS

TODDLER ROOM

Our toddler room is for ages 2-4 years old. Parents provide lunch, and we supply two snacks during the day. We have nap time around 12:30 p.m. While the child is in diapers, those and wipes are supplied by parents. This room has all the things to work the imagination. We have dress-up clothes, a play kitchen, many baby dolls, puppets, cars, and trucks. Also, there are different types of blocks and playsets for pretend. The daily routine includes reading, songs, dancing, stretches, crafts, and learning. Here, through song and instruction, we start to recognize our ABCs, colors, and shapes. Posters and puzzles with these themes help. We start to recognize our names. We love playing in water or birdseed. All in preparation for Preschool!

PRESCHOOL

Our preschool is for 3 and 4 year old's from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 Noon. Here we have themed lessons, fun crafts, songs, and dancing. Our Teacher and Aide guide us through stories of the Bible, writing our letters and names. We start to learn the calendar, days of the week, and we talk about weather. We enjoy trying out instruments and playing in water or sand. One snack is provided by the parents during preschool.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE

We work with Cornell Elementary and provide after-school care for children 5 years old up to 9 years old. The children come straight to the Day School from their school on a bus. We bring them in and provide a snack and playtime. This is a great way to burn off energy after a long school day. We can help with homework, but also play board games and do crafts.
